DESIGNATED: 2001

At 2,382 acres, Red Mountain is Washington's smallest and typically its warmest appellation, where growing season daytime temperatures average 90 degrees, gets only 5 inches (127 mm) of rain each year. It is dedicated almost exclusively to red wine grapes and produces some of the state's most sought-after grapes.
